IECA Provides Online Training for CPESC, Inc.'s New Inspector Certification Program

Steamboat Springs, CO—Once again the International Erosion Control Association and CPESC, Inc. will team up to provide online preparatory classes for certification exams. The focus of the latest series of online classes is CPESC's new certification program Certified Erosion, Sediment and Storm Water Inspector (CESSWI).

The six part series, taught by Jimmy Eanes, CPESC-IT, CESSWI, will take place on Tuesdays beginning January 8, 2008. The modules will help prepare attendees to take the CESSWI exam which will be offered Friday, February 22 at Environmental Connection 2008, IECA's annual conference and expo in Orlando, Florida. The series will address the following topics:

- Documentation & Inspector Duties
- Plan Management
- Best Management Practices Part 1
- Best Management Practices Part 2
